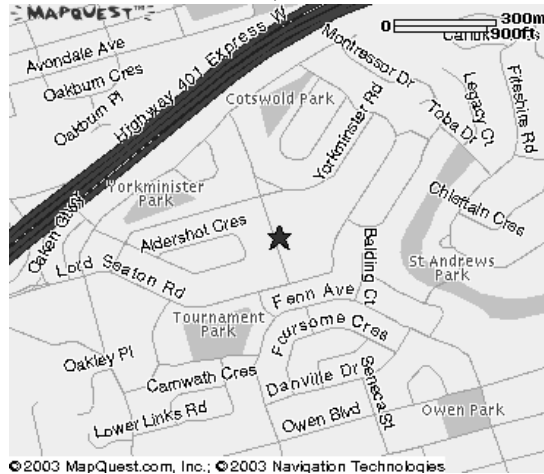


**DIRECTIONS TO FAIRMEADOW**

**EASTBOUND ON 401**

Exit at Avenue Road South  
 One block to Wilson Avenue East  
 North on Yonge St to Lord Seaton (part of 401 East on ramp)  
 Turn left on Yorkminster to Fairmeadow  
 Turn right at Fairmeadow to the school

**FROM DOWNTOWN** (south of York Mills)

Follow Eastbound instructions from: North on Yonge

**WESTBOUND ON 401**

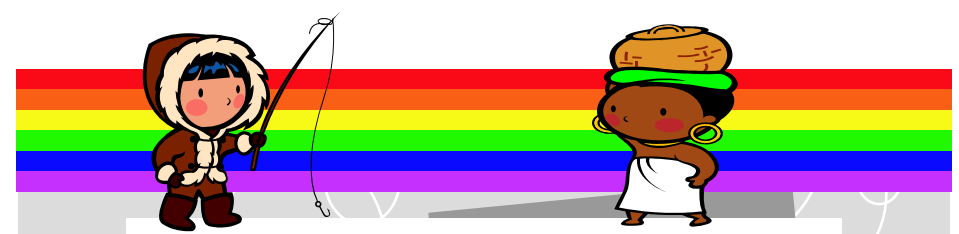
Exit at Yonge Street South  
 South on Yonge (under bridge)  
 East on 401 East ramp/Lord Seaton Road  
 Stay on Lord Seaton to Yorkminster Road  
 Turn left on Yorkminster to Fairmeadow  
 Turn right at Fairmeadow to the school

**FROM UPTOWN** (north of Sheppard)

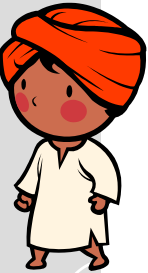
Follow Westbound instructions from: South on Yonge

**TDSB LAUNCHES POSITIVE SPACE CAMPAIGN**
